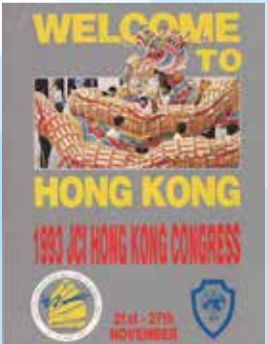

JCI Hong Kong commemorating its 65th Anniversary themed by "Celebration with Appreciation"

The Junior Chamber International Hong Kong (JCIHK) tonight held an anniversary ball in the AsiaWorld-Expo to celebrate its 65 years of establishment in Hong Kong on May 9, 2015.

National President Anthony Leung speaking in the ball attended by over 700 guests, overseas delegates and members, "JCI Hong Kong has continued to expand its networks and provide various platforms for the youth since 1950, including offering business development opportunity and holding youth functions. The aims are to enhance social responsibility and leadership of the youth, for creating the positive change and a making better Hong Kong."

The Hon C Y LEUNG, GBM, GBS, JP, the Chief Executive of HKSARG as the Guest of Honor and speaking, "JCI Hong Kong is dedicated to nurture the youth of the community." He mentioned that he was impressed by ability and talents of the Hong Kong young people in his recent trip of academic exchange in Boston. The Government will strongly support the youth to achieve their goals, as well as thank JCI Hong Kong for its continuous contribution to youth affairs.

The members are between the age of 18 to 40 who make full use of their leisure hours to work for creating positive changes on the community and themselves. Four areas of opportunity are provided in JCIHK, namely Leadership, Community, International and Business.
